COMPETITION INFORMATION

This competition is open to any eligible skater who is a member in good standing of US Figure Skating or Skate Canada, will be conducted in accordance with the rules of US Figure Skating governing non-qualifying competitions, and will be governed by the official rules of US Figure Skating as specified in the current US Figure Skating rulebook, except as modified by this announcement. The Skaneateles FSC reserves the right to subdivide any event if necessary, and to cancel any event if there are fewer than two entries. Competitors may not compete below their test levels as of November 1, 2011. Skaters may, however, compete at one level higher. Free Skating test level passed is the criteria for Free Skating and Compulsory Moves. Age restrictions are as of day of competition. Judging will be in accordance with the 2011-2012 US Figure Skating rulebook.

Entries: BOTH mail and online entries will be accepted. All mail entries must be postmarked by November 1, 2011. Secure online entry with credit card payment will be available at www.eteamz.com/skanfsc or <http://comp.entryeeze.com/Home.aspx?cid=255> and must be completed by midnight on November 1, 2011. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Competition Committee. Competitors may enter as many events as they like, provided they meet the entry requirements. THE FIRST 250 ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

There will be a \$30.00 fee for all returned checks.

Refunds: Entry fee refunds, **minus the online processing fee**, are available if the entry is withdrawn before November 1, 2011. After November 1, 2011, entry refunds are only available if the competition is not held or there is a death in the competitor's immediate family. No refunds will be issued for events scheduled on a day the skater is unable to attend. There will be NO medical refunds given. Please contact sfcsk8comp@aol.com for refund information. **If you register online, the processing fee is not refundable for any reason.**

Judging: This competition will be judged using the both the IJS and the 6.0 system.

Schedules: Skater and Coaches schedules will be available via the web at www.eteamz.com/skanfsc as soon as possible after the close of entries. Notification of competition ice times will NOT be available by phone, mail or email.

Music: Competitors are required to provide their own music CDs for Free Skate programs, Short programs, and Showcase. No CD-RW discs will be accepted. Each CD must be clearly labeled with name, home club, event and running time. Only one selection should be on the CD. Music should be turned in at registration at least one hour before the event. Skaters should bring a duplicate copy of all music.

Rink: The competition will be held at the WG Allyn Arena inside the Skaneateles YMCA Community Center, 97 State Street Road in Skaneateles, New York. Rink size is 85 feet x 200 feet.

Awards: Individual medals will be presented to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place. All other participants will receive ribbons. A club trophy will be awarded to the club accruing the most competition points (excluding Showcase events) for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place. Home club does not vie for the club trophy. Awards will be presented in the lobby every hour during the competition.

Results: Copies will be available at the registration desk: \$1.00/page for IJS events, \$0.25 per copy for 6.0 events.

Accidents: The WG Allyn Arena and the Skaneateles Figure Skating Club, its officers, and representatives accept no liability for damage or injuries suffered by skaters, officials, or spectators during this event.

1. TEST TRACK

Skaters may enter EITHER the new test track free skate program or the well-balanced track free skate program but **NOT** both during the same non-qualifying competition. Competitors will skate to music of their choice, vocal music permitted. The 6.0 judging system will be used for all Test Track events. Deductions **WILL** be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description.

4. SOLO SHOWCASE

Basis of Judging: Performances will be judged solely on theatrical and artistic qualities from an entertainment standpoint. Technical skating, skill and difficulty are not marked. However, skating must be the major element of the performance. USFSA judges may or may not be used for this event. Skaters will be judged in the following areas: music interpretation, audience appeal, choreography, and overall performance. **Costumes:** For the safety of skaters, do not use feathers or beads that may come off the costume or props during the performance. The referee has the right to deem any prop as hazardous to the skater or ice conditions and may not allow its use. **Divisions:** Each level can include men and ladies. The competition committee reserves the right to combine divisions should low registration make it necessary. **Performance Time:** Times listed are maximum performance times. There is no minimum time. Referee will allow 30 seconds for placement of non hand-held props. Performances exceeding their time by more than 10 seconds will result in a marking penalty. Timing starts with the first motion of the body. Skaters may enter only one level of showcase.

5. INDIVIDUAL JUMP EVENT

Skater may skate at their Freeskate test level or higher. Beginner through Pre-Juvenile level skaters will use half ice surface. Jumps must be performed exactly as stated, and **MUST BE SKATED IN THE ORDER LISTED**. Skaters will have two attempts to skate each element, and will be judged on the better of the two. An axel will be considered a single jump. **When skaters are given a choice of jumps, they may not change the jump (or combination) after their first attempt.**

Skaters must present a program, including the required moves, in any order, without music, within the time allowed. Connecting moves and footwork may be used, but will not be judged. Variations allowed in all spins, except as noted.

8. INTERPRETIVE

Skaters may enter at test level or up one level. The Competition Committee will choose music and skaters will hear the music played during warm-up. Skaters will be judged on originality, musical and artistic expression, and ice coverage. Technical elements will be judged on their appropriateness to the music. No costumes or props allowed. Male and female competitors may be combined. Coaching is NOT permitted.

9. SOLO DANCE

2012 NATIONAL SOLO DANCE COMPETITION SERIES RULES

NOTE: If you are not a registered U.S. Figure Skating Solo Dance Series participant for this season, you may still compete in this event.

Eligibility: Events are open to eligible or reinstated persons and the members of other governing bodies which are members of ISU.

Judging: Performance will be judged using the 6.0 judging system with two marks given for each performance.

Testing Requirements:

Test requirements must be met at the date entries are closed. All skaters must compete at the level of their most recently completed dances test* as of the entry deadline or skaters may compete one level above their current test level. Skaters may not change levels once the deadline has passed and/or their individual form is submitted to U.S. Figure Skating. Subsequent changes will not affect eligibility.

Officials: Officials will be chosen from both competition and test level judges.

How it works:

1. Skaters' top results from three of the selected nonqualifying competitions in their section or two competitions within their section and one competition outside of their section. Their placements will be tracked throughout the Solo Dance competitive season. (Skaters may compete at more than three events, but only the top three scores will count toward total points.) In order for a skater to advance, he/she must compete in at least two of the specified solo dance competitions within their section.)
2. The six skaters with the top points in each division and section will advance to the National Solo Dance Championships in Colorado Springs, Colorado.

National Solo Dance Championships:

Top six skaters from each section in each level (preliminary, pre-bronze, bronze, pre-silver, silver, pre-gold and gold) will advance to the National Solo Dance Championships. This will allow for an overall total of 18 skaters in each level at the National Solo Dance Championships.

Each level will be split into two qualifying rounds with the skaters competing two dances within their level. The athletes finishing in the top four in each qualifying round will advance to the Championship round where they will compete the final dance(s). The skaters' placement in the championship round only will determine their final placements overall.
